Administrative Council

During a brief meeting on Sunday, July 24, the Solid Rock Administrative Council approved a one-time gift of \$3,250 to Pastor Kathy Newton. The gift is funded from the portion of a recent bequest that Council designated to the General Fund, and came to Council as a recommendation of both the Pastor-Staff Relations Committee and the Finance Committee.

Council also learned at this meeting that Solid Rock has received a second portion of the bequest from the Maro Wall estate in the amount of \$157,417. According to the terms of this gift, one-half is directed to the Building Fund and one-half is to be used to establish a trust.

The first portion of this bequest, in the amount of \$186,000, was previously appor-

President Myrna Neff introduced Deb Johnson, the N.E. District officer for Social Action, who was the main speaker of the day. What a meaningful program she presented—a lesson, surprisingly, on the Holocaust, which must never be forgotten although it happened many years ago. Prejudice arises when people treat others with isolation and discrimination, including at its worst physical attack, ending with extermination. This is, of course, the history of the Germans intent to eliminate the Jews of Europe, plus other minority peoples. Deb has worked at the Holocaust Museum in Washington, D.C. She cited lessons to be learned for everyone: Do not let it happen again; each of us must have a part in making the world a better place because we've been here; we must recognize that underneath our customary ways, we are all the same.

Roll call noted 14 members present. Minutes of the June meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer's report noted a June 30 balance of \$193.61.
