Administrative Council

The Solid Rock Administrative Council met on January 18. Treasurer Myrna Neff reported that building funds currently total \$563,367. Council designated monthly birthday and anniversary offerings to missions. Their use will be determined by the Missions Committee.

The Building/Site Committee reported that they are in the process of interviewing general contractors. Refinement of the floor plan of the building continues. The committee noted that the architect has addressed concerns and suggestions from the congregation, within the constraints of projected funding. The congregation will be invited to a presentation of the current design configuration on February 20. If the plan presented at that time is received favorably, final planning will move forward, with the possibility of a construction start date later this year.

Council approved the purchase of a replacement computer for the church office and an external hard drive for data backup.

Malta House Benefit Dinner

On Friday, January 21, the Malta House held a benefit dinner and concert at Central Christian Church in Huntington. Pastor Kellie Herber of the Malta House opened up the evening by thanking the volunteers that made this event possible and blessing the meal.

The Malta House is a men's shelter located in Huntington at 505 South Jefferson Street. The Malta House Facebook page states "We are a non-denominational 24-hour men's emergency boarding shelter. We offer long and short term opportunities for homeless men."

Pamela and I enjoyed the wonderful meal, especially the desert. The entertainment for the evening was Judy Ruble, singing classic country songs. A group of local line dancers also performed.

Pastor Kellie spoke about the great work God is doing through this ministry. She explained that though the Malta House has 12 beds for men, they have had as many 16 residents at one time. Forty men have been served by Malta House since its beginning six short months ago. Kellie stated that since opening, many ideas that were thought to be sure fire successes failed while other ideas that didn't seem very promising have been successful. One of those programs is working on homes for donations. Volunteers work side by side with residents, teaching them good working skills like dry wall repair, painting, etc., that may help these men land a position in the future. Pastor Kellie said that she sincerely hoped to see all of those in attendance visit the Malta House and participate in being the hands and feet of Jesus Christ.

Pastor Kellie then asked Pastor Chris Hayden from Central Christian to speak. Chris spoke on how the name was chosen for Malta House. He read from Acts 27 and 28, the shipwreck of Paul. As we know, all aboard the ship were saved and found safe refuge on the island of Malta. Chris was very clear in stating that any one of us could be impacted by the same circumstances that have brought the "shipwrecked sailors" to the Malta House. Malta House is a warm and safe refuge for the men from our area.

I would like to echo Pastor Kellie's invitation to all at Solid Rock to visit Malta House and see God's work in our community.

As many of you already know, my granddaughter, Jessica, has recently undergone spinal surgery. She, and the rest of our family, want to express our sincerest gratitude for your prayers and kind expressions of interest. Her doctors are amazed at how quickly and well her recovery is progressing. However, there is a "background story" I feel compelled to share with you.

Having to check into the hospital at 5:00 a.m. on Monday, Jessica and her husband, Marc, were on their way shortly after 4:30 a.m. The reality of going into surgery really hit Jessica then and she tearfully admitted she was frightened. She began to pray: "Dear Lord, please let Your will be done. I cannot ask for any more than that, Lord. Please let Your will be done. All I can ask, Dear Lord, please be with me in the operating room. I am so scared and I don't want to be alone in there. I pray in the name of Jesus. Amen.

Immediately upon uttering "Amen" her phone "dinged" indicating a text message. It was a text from her boss, a woman known far and wide as *not* being a morning person. Jessica was shocked. Getting a message from her boss at that hour of the morning was beyond all expectations. She assumed it must have been written the previous evening and was delayed for some unexplained reason. (Don't ask me, I don't text.)

The text read "...thus saith the Lord...I have heard thy prayers, I have seen thy tears...behold, I will heal thee.... 2 Kings 20:5"

The day following her surgery, Jessica's boss revealed she had set the alarm to wake her during the time she knew they would be traveling to the hospital. Jessica later called me to relate the experience. She stated she knew God used her boss to be His messenger, and that we should all take from this an admonition to be ready and open to the call whenever God wants us to be messengers for Him.

In the schools—NO, at home—NO, at church—NO, there is no church in their life.

Then a teacher began tell of a student that had brought an offering to the trailer and how she had begun to talk to the student that she should take it to her church. In a piece of paper, all folded and taped up real tight was 32 cents. The student said the Bible trailer was her church. The teacher took the money and gave it to our director. We were in her house and she went to the other room and brought it out to show us. She could not turn loose of it.

Are you blessed? If your know the CHRISTMAS story, if you have heard it from your parents or grandparents, if you are able to be in church regularly, if you have a place of prayer and have been taught to pray, if you have a relationship with God – YOU ARE BLESSED.
