Administrative Council

The Solid Rock Administrative Council met on January 17. It was reported that money from the Warming Tree was given to Lancaster, Lincoln, Southern Wells, and Salamonie Schools to help with some of the children in need of warm clothing. Also, money was given for Rose Broyles to buy needed things for the children of the Food Pantry. We also had donations of gloves, hats and scarves for the schools in need of those items.

It was reported the church mortgage is down to \$84,796.

The Kitchen Committee has been to the parsonage and developed a drawing for the new kitchen. They will be getting bids soon for this project.

There will be a concession stand meeting to get input for a new concession stand building at Tower Park.

The church's free soup supper will be February 14, from 5:00-6:30 p.m. This is for the church and community. The church will also be having a pulled pork carry-out lunch and sit-down supper on March 18. This is a free-will offering with proceeds going to The Way, a community youth group sponsored by the Warren Area Ministerial Association.

If the church should be cancelled for bad weather, the announcement will be aired on WBCL (90.3 FM). We will also look into putting it on a TV station.

The Grapevine Cluster, of which Solid Rock is a member, will be going on a mission trip to Henderson Settlement the week of March 26 through April 1. The cost will be between \$200 and \$250 per person. To help with the expenses, there will be a hot cakes breakfast on February 4 at the Liberty Center Church from 7:00 to 11:00 a.m. If you would be interested in this mission trip, please let Pastor Paul or the church office know.

The church has decided to get a CVLI license so that movies can be shown at the church if any group would like to do this.

What does it mean to hunger and thirst after righteousness? When I first heard this question I thought that they were pulling my leg, just testing me. The ones that asked were sea-

soned Christians, or so I thought. So I ask, what does it mean to hunger and thirst after food? Your answer might be at least three times a day my belly tells my head that I haven't eaten anything in a long time and it is time to eat. If I ignore it



then the signal gets louder. After a while it gets so that either I eat or I get in pain. That is the normal reaction from the physical body. When I eat something, even if it is not what I really want, the body becomes satisfied enough to stop the pain. I may still be hungry for something specific but I am not at the point of discomfort anymore.

What makes you to be hungry physically? It is not anything that you do. You are born with a hunger for food to sustain your physical body. I have seen very few babies that after a little while from being born they are not ready to eat. Most of the babies are ready to eat within a little while (Continued on page 3)

profit organization that was created in 1987 by lay leaders John Shettle and Bob Bowman of the United Methodist Church (UMC) in Indiana. Today Operation Classroom is in partnership with over 20 schools, two hospitals, and continues to draw attention to the needs of West Africa.

Operation Classroom is dedicated to improving education for young Liberians. Each school has

different priorities and needs that OC is helping to meet. Many of these schools are in need of equipment, such as computers, sewing machines, baking and cooking pans

and utensils, drafting supplies, etc. OC also believes it is important to have school counselors to guide the students' moral and spiritual growth and to oversee the proper

development and functions of the school. It has accordingly encouraged provisions for school counselors, both male and female, at each school. OC provides support and bi -annual training for these counselors. In the past few years funding has been provided for teachers in the vocational training program. Several schools presently have a pressing need for new primary classrooms and school furniture for these rooms.

Essential to its financial support for local schools in Liberia, OC provides every partner school with scholarships for 100 students. It sends out donated books, school supplies and medical equipment. OC has committed millions of dollars to its ministry in West Africa. But it does not only send money and objects to Liberia and Sierra Leone. OC has many men and women in Indiana who volunteer their time and talents for people in Liberia and Sierra Leone.

Africa University

Africa University is a private, international higher education institution located just outside of Mutare, Zimbabwe and founded in March 1992 by the United Methodist Church. The University welcomes students from all nations of Africa



without regard to race, class, ethnicity or political and religious affiliation. The University's annual enrollment is al-

most 1,400 students from 25 countries. United Methodists of Indiana have long been involved in missions on the continent of Africa. Several years ago, the former North and South Indiana Conferences each built and dedicated two dormitories on the campus of Africa University. These four buildings were a fine addition to the campus, but there is more to education than buildings.

Donations to Africa University are more than just money, but provide the opportunity for young leaders to be raised up and educated on the challenges that face Africa and the world abroad. Giving makes a real difference in the lives of students and has lasting effects in helping shape a brighter future for the continent of Africa.

after they are born. They do not want a steak, they want milk. They are not able to eat and digest steak or any solid food; they must have milk because that is all that their system can handle at this point.

So how do you get hungry and thirsty spiritually? When you gave your life to Jesus he put a clean new feeling inside of you and you had a desire to do things that pleased him. Along with that clean feeling you received a hunger to find out who Jesus is and what he wants from you. You received a desire to read the Bible. So you take your Bible and start reading at Genesis and get so very confused that you eventually quit reading instead of asking for help. When you quit reading and praying it is like going on a long fast physically, your spirit gets to where it doesn't matter anymore. On a long fast physically you eventually get to the point that food does not even appeal to you. Your body needs it but you have no desire for it. You will actually lose your hunger. The same thing happens spiritually, when you quit feeding your spirit you eventually lose your desire to eat spiritually. You lose your hunger for the word of God and everything that goes with it.

What must I do to get my hunger back? In order to get hungry again you must start eating again. Sometimes it is a very hard task to rebuild your hunger again. Like coming off a long fast you must force yourself to eat and deal with the pains and other things that come with starting to eat again. In the spiritual side of this, when you lose your hunger for the things of God you must go back to the altar and search yourself to find out why you lost your hunger. When the Lord tells you the answer to that, you must start force feeding your spirit. It is not an easy task. You must read the word of God even when you don't feel like it. You must pray even when you don't feel like it. You must read the word of God even when it puts you to sleep. You may have to read out loud in order to get more of your senses involved to keep yourself awake. When you go to sleep praying, pray out loud so that you can get your whole body involved and keep yourself awake. You will have spiritual pain in order to get through it, but if you want to keep your spirit alive you have to do it; if not your spirit will die.

Jesus said in John 6:35 "I am the bread of life: those that come to me shall never hunger; and those that believe in me shall never thirst." So how do you keep from hungering and thirsting for righteousness?

All you have to do is come to him humbly. Read his word and study it. Not just when you feel like it but every day without fail. If you will make the effort to get to him he will make the effort to get to you. He will not fail to meet you when you try to get to him with our whole heart. He will take away your hunger, and as long as you believe in him you will never get spiritually thirsty. Over the next few months we will be studying the book of Mark from the pulpit. It is my prayer that through this study you will begin the process of feeding your spirit.
