
Disaffiliation Update

Solid Rock's transition from the United Methodist Church to the Global Methodist Church is nearly complete. Required documents were submitted to the Indiana Conference of the UMC by the May 11 deadline. Disaffiliation will be officially approved by the Annual Conference, meeting June 8-10, and will be effective July 1, 2023.

Notification was received on May 1 that Solid Rock's application to join the Global Methodist Church has been approved and will be in effect on July 1, 2023.

A committee reviewed Solid Rock's administrative structure and made recom-

mendations to the Administrative Council, which accepted them at their May meeting. Only minor changes have been made. The revised structure will guide the Nominations Committee



when they meet in late summer, and changes will be in effect for 2024.

Some signage around the church will be changing, as UMC designations are removed. For legal purposes, the name of the church will be Solid Rock Church of Warren, Inc. Incorporation under the new name took place on May 3.

Commonly we will refer to ourselves as Solid Rock Church. A rebranding effort is underway, including updated signage, a new website, and a renamed and refreshed newsletter. Newly branded shirts and other apparel are now available for purchase.

Explanation of the Gifts

Two concepts are involved in spiritual gifts. First, a spiritual gift to an individual is God's enablement for personal spiritual service (1 Cor. 12:11). Second, a spiritual gift to the church is a person uniquely equipped for the church's edification and maturation (Eph. 4:11–13). It should also be noted what is not meant by spiritual gifts. It does not mean a place of service. Some may suggest "he has a real gift for working in the slums. This, of course, is a wrong concept of spiritual gifts. Nor is a spiritual gift an age group ministry. Or some might say that "he has a real gift for working with senior highs." A spiritual gift is not the same as a natural talent; there may be a relationship, but a natural talent is an ability that a person may have from birth and develop, whereas a spiritual gift is given supernaturally by God at the moment of conversion. Natural talents and gifts may be contrasted thus:

COMPARISON OF NATURAL AND SPIRITUAL ABILITIES

Source:

- Natural Talents: From God through parents
- Spiritual Gifts: From God independent of parents

Possessed:

- Natural Talents: From birth
- Spiritual Gifts: Probably from conversion

With the attendance of organized churches dwindling for various reasons, there also is a growing need for people to assist those who are seeking a church home to find what their needs require. The church is more than just a place to hear a sermon or to attend Sunday School; it's a gathering place for people to use their gifts and talents for the glory of God and to bless those in the church body and the community. So, what are gifts and talents and how do we develop them to empower us to be used by God? Does it mean we have to go to seminary or something else?

Look at the reference from *The Moody Handbook of Theology*. I chose this because it gives us good insight into gifts and talents. We have various gifts and talents granted to us by God. These gifts are to be utilized to draw others to God, to meet the needs of others, and to assist in helping others to develop and use their gifts. This is done by mentoring, discipleship, and relationships with God and others.

It seems to me a perplexing question I hear often from others is, "What are my gifts and where do I fit in with God's plan?" People question where they fit in with God's plan, where they use their gifts and talents, and they even question what gifts they might have. They question this because they see what their faults are and feel inadequate or unworthy to be used by God for something great. In both my pastoral ministry and mental health work, I have worked with countless individuals who struggle with God accepting them, healing them, forgiving them, and/or using them to help others. They only see themselves as broken or flawed. This hinders their ability to feel "good enough" to be used by God. They don't know where they might fit in without feeling the "judgment" of others when it's their own self-judgment

that prohibits their participation in serving God in a church setting. If we were able to work with these individuals, we could help them to see that we



ALL are broken and have failed numerous times, yet God continues to not only forgive us but also calls us to utilize the gifts and talents we have for the greater good.

The question I have for you, the readers and the church members, is Where do you want to fit in? People will try to "fit" you in places that might not be your area of passion. Passion is that drive that makes us feel that I need to do this because... If you're not passionate about what you believe your calling is, you might be hindered in developing a passion for serving. This doesn't include the testing of gifts and talents; this is for those that you have already discovered or know for a fact are the gifts and talents you have. Sometimes, we discover our gifts by accident: we are thrust into a situation and when we see our efforts work and we feel good about the outcome, we begin to believe that we can make a positive difference in the lives of others. This often becomes a passion for us and we actually find a place to fit in the circle of life as we know it.

What are my gifts and talents? Only you and God can define this. Yes, others can assist you in identifying them, but only God can empower you with these gifts. Your gifts may include the following (but are not limited to):

- Preaching and teaching
- Discernment
- Hospitality
- Servanthood
- Compassion
- Healing (various aspects that include physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual healing)
- Administration

And so much more. Please note that all of these can be inside or outside the church setting. Many can develop passions to serve outside the church setting. Coming to church allows us and others to know what is available to the body and where we can network the gifts we have to utilize them to bless others.

Where do you fit in? Wherever you want to fit in. It is my hope that God directs you to share your gifts and talents where you feel comfortable and called to be. If you are wondering how to fit in, feel free to contact me at pastoriohn@solidrockwarren.org

Sharing the load

In 1969 the Hollies released "He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother." Do you know the story behind that song title?

Fifty years earlier in Omaha, Nebraska, a boy with polio was abandoned at Father Flanagan's Home for Boys, predecessor to the Boys Town organization. Soon several

older residents started carrying young Howard with his heavy leg braces — especially up stairs. Father Flanagan once saw an older boy, Reuben, doing this and asked if it



was hard work. Reuben replied, "He ain't heavy, Father. He's my brother." Years later, these words and the image of one person carrying another became the Boys Town brand.

All of us have been "carried" at some point, and we've likely "carried" someone else. The Hollies' song declares: "His welfare is my concern." Jesus said it this way: "Love your neighbor as yourself." The load isn't too heavy to bear because Jesus himself is always carrying us.






