Disaffiliation Update

In a church conference on April 16, 2023, 87% of the 45 Solid Rock members in attendance voted to affiliate with the Global Methodist Church. This followed a March 14 vote to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church and concludes Solid Rock's discernment process.

The process of submitting documents and completing other steps to fulfill disaffiliation requirements continues. The application for affiliation with the Global Methodist Church has been submitted. The transition will officially take effect on July 1.

Most Solid Rock members will notice few differences as a result of this change in affiliation as doctrines and procedures will be similar. Pastor John will remain at Solid Rock and will transition to the GMC as well.

Solid Rock will take this opportunity to review its administrative structure, although any changes are expected to be minor. Any signage with United Methodist Church designation will be removed or replaced. Likewise, the domain name of the current website will change. Look for announcements regarding the new website over the next couple of months.

God's Wisdom for Man

Please read 1 Corinthians 2:6-16

"The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. For who among men knows the thoughts of a man except the man's spirit within him? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God." Vs. 10b – 11; NIV

WISDOM The ability to direct one's mind toward a full understanding of human life and toward its moral fulfillment. Wisdom is thus a special capacity, necessary for full human living; it can be acquired through education and the application of the mind.

It is said that throughout all of history, King Solomon was the wisest of all when it came to wisdom. His story is found in the book of 1 Kings chapter 3.

When you read this, one is left speechless with his first demonstration of said wisdom. I feel that if I was able to establish just a small portion of wisdom, I would be lucky! Well, I'm not lucky, but something better. (Not that I am better than he, but blessed; which will be explained in greater detail in moments from now.) The story shows that Solomon's wisdom was a direct blessing from God and a gift. The New Testament shares that there is none wiser in all of history than Solomon. So, how can I make such a bold statement?

Getting to know the GMC

The Global Methodist Church was created as a result of divisions within the United Methodist Church. The denomination launched on May 1, 2022.

According to Rev. Keith Boyette, Transitional Connectional Officer of the Global Methodist Church, “The GM Church’s primary focus is on its mission – to make disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly. It is a Church that intentionally empowers local congregations to have maximum discretion in the way they organize and deploy resources for ministry. The denomination maintains a small institutional footprint to ensure local churches have the resources to support the ministry to which they are called. The GM Church exists to empower local churches;

to serve, not to be served.”

Leaders who have worked to develop this new denomination have sought to streamline it administratively. The structure is simpler and more decentralized, seeking to empower the local church to make decisions best enabling it to carry out its mission. With less bureaucracy, apportionments will be lower, leaving more re-

sources for local ministry. Apportionments will be reduced by about half of what they were in the United Methodist Church.

The emphasis on reducing administrative structure

means that, rather than creating many of its own agencies, the Global Methodist Church will encourage local churches to partner with ministries that already exist and that they choose because they fit the local church’s process for making disciples.

As of mid-March, there were approximately 1,350 Global Methodist congregations and 1,900 clergy members, representing eight countries. This number will grow as more United Methodist congregations disaffiliate during 2023, and many choose to join the GMC. Nine provisional annual conferences have been established thus far, with an additional eight in development.

The convening General Conference of the Global Methodist Church is anticipated to take place in the summer or fall of 2024. The delay in scheduling this first conference is intended to enable as many churches and annual conferences as possible to participate in this foundational event. In the meantime, the denomination is governed by the Transitional Book of Doctrines and Discipline which, after some possible revision, is expected to be ratified at this convening General Conference.

Solid Rock will be part of the recently formed Great Lakes Annual Conference, which includes congregations in the states of Wisconsin, Michigan, Illinois, and Indiana. Currently more than 50 Indiana congregations have affiliated with the Global Methodist Church, with more expected following disaffiliation from the UMC of many congregations in June. Fewer churches in Wisconsin, Michigan, and Illinois have affiliated with the Global Methodist church at this point due to the fact that their first opportunities to disaffiliate from the UMC will be later this year.

Global Methodist Church — FAQs

What is the Global Methodist Church?

It is a church committed to making disciples of Jesus Christ who worship passionately, love extravagantly, and witness boldly. The Global Methodist Church is filled with warm-hearted, Jesus loving, and Holy Spirit inspired people. They are grounded in Scripture and the life giving confessions of the Christian faith found in the Apostles’ and the Nicene Creeds.

Who is leading the Global Methodist Church?

Officially, the 17 member Transitional Leadership Council is leading the Global Methodist Church during its transitional phase. However, over a thousand people have had a role in giving shape to it and bringing it into existence. Clergy and lay people in Africa, Europe, Eurasia, the Philippines and the United States have sacrificially given of their time, talent, and resources to discern God’s will for the formation of the Global Methodist Church. During its transitional phase, the church will be governed by the Transitional Book of Doctrines and Discipline. Ultimately, duly elected delegates to the Global Methodist Church’s convening General Conference will prayerfully seek God’s will for the church’s future. The convening General Conference will adopt a Book of Doctrines and Discipline to replace the transitional document.

When will the Global Methodist Church hold its convening conference?

The Global Methodist Church’s Transitional Leadership Council will work to determine the most feasible dates for holding its convening General Conference. During a transitional period of 12 to 18 months, local churches and annual conferences everywhere, and central conferences in Africa, Europe, Eurasia, and the Philippines will have the opportunity to join the Global Methodist Church. Once local churches and conferences make their decisions, the Transitional Leadership Council will apportion delegates accordingly, and invite them to the Global Methodist Church’s convening General Conference.

What are the core beliefs of the Global Methodist Church?

That the one God – the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit – has created all things; that Jesus Christ, through the power of his cross and Resurrection, is the Lord and Savior of all the world; and that the Holy Spirit empowers the people of his church to worship and praise God and to proclaim the Gospel throughout the world in word and deed.

Easily.

Solomon was gifted this wisdom from God and retained it. This was the wisdom about the world and he used it mostly for God in leading his kingdom. The world infiltrated his wisdom and Solomon began to make poor judgments which would later turn his heart aside from God. God would eventually tear the kingdom from Solomon's hands. Today, wisdom is not as highly sought from God because man believes his wisdom is better than God's. Man believes he has all the answers and when God confronts man's intentions, man ignores God's ultimate wisdom. Only believers who search for His wisdom will find it. (This is where my bold statement takes root.)

A man knows man's wisdom. His wisdom only goes so far before it hits a roadblock. A man also knows that roadblock is impassible until he obtains God's wisdom. However, to do that, he must be willing to abandon the wisdom he has come to understand as truth. All that a man believes to know and believe becomes foolish when compared to God's wisdom. God's wisdom is far deeper and more trustworthy than ALL of man's understanding. The Holy Spirit knows God's wisdom because He knows God. The Holy Spirit is intimate with God and is God (part of the Trinity). The Holy Spirit also knows man's wisdom because the Trinity created mankind and all else. Man didn't create God (although, man tries to create God in his own image).

God wants to share this wisdom with man, but will man accept it or reject it? You might ask yourself why the man might reject God's wisdom; only to discover that man's desires often get in the way of his relationship with God. God's wisdom for man draws man closer to Himself. God wants us to go deeper in the understanding of Him, yet man desires worldly things, which include having independent wisdom. That mindset doesn't draw us toward God but apart from Him. Man has no hope of spiritual fulfillment when he is apart from God.

When we are believers of all that Jesus Christ is, He opens us up to a relationship with the Father and sends the Holy Spirit to teach us His wisdom to be enlightened to our purpose with God and to share this with others we know. If you are searching for ways to become closer to God, if you are longing for ways to live for God, to better forgive others/self, the Holy Spirit is your person to connect with. Man can't do

this, but the Holy Spirit can.

Life immortal

At the end of May, Americans honor those who've died for our country — and remember all deceased loved ones. These times of reflection, often in cemeteries, can make us ponder our own mortality. Even some Christians may fear the unknown of death.



Yet because of our faith, followers of Jesus can aim to make productive use of whatever earthly time we have left. We know the grave isn't the end. Consider this poetic description of life everlasting from Henry Wadsworth Longfellow: "Dust thou art, to dust returnest / was not spoken of the soul."

To our death-defying, death-defeating God we pray: Eternal God, empower us to take hold of the eternal life to which Christ calls us, and to boldly testify of it to anyone who asks the reason for our hope. To the immortal King of the ages, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel, to him be honor, glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

Honor your mother

Anna Jarvis, the woman who first suggested a national day to honor mothers, had an incredible mother to honor. Her mom, Ann Reeves Jarvis (1832-1905), was a Sunday school teacher and activist who helped lower infant-mortality rates in Appalachia and promoted friendship among families of Civil War soldiers.

At a memorial service for her mother, Anna Jarvis distributed carnations — her mom's favorite flower — to attendees. Her idea to set apart one day each year for moms gained traction, and in 1914, President Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday of May Mother's Day. It was customary by then to wear white carnations in honor of departed mothers and red carnations to honor the living.

Of the white flowers, Jarvis said they "symbolize the truth, purity and broad-

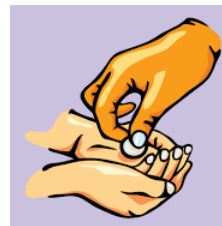

charity of mother love; its fragrance, her memory, and her prayers. The carnation does not drop its petals, but hugs them to its heart as it dies, and so, too, mothers hug their children to their hearts, their mother love never dying."

Come as you are

As a young pastor, Stan Purdum de-husked black walnuts one Saturday, not realizing his hands would be badly stained. They looked filthy, he recalls, and the marks would not wash off; they'd have to wear off. Then Purdum realized he'd be serving Holy Communion the next day.



Before distributing the elements, the pastor apologized to congregants, explaining that his hands were washed but just stained. Years later, Purdum reflected: "Now that I have a fuller grasp of theology under my belt, I think a better thing for me to say would have been, 'Nobody comes to Communion with clean hands.'"

We're all unworthy to receive Jesus' body and blood, but that's exactly why he offers it. Thanks be to God for redeeming and forgiving us — wiping away the stain of our sins!

TONGUES OF FIRE — Reminiscent of the Pentecost account in Acts 2 when “tongues of fire” rested on the disciples’ heads as the Holy Spirit birthed the church, images of flame symbolize the Spirit. Sometimes a tongue of fire is paired with a dove and set on a red background — other symbols of the Holy Spirit. Fire may also indicate spiritual fervor and zeal in a Christian’s life.

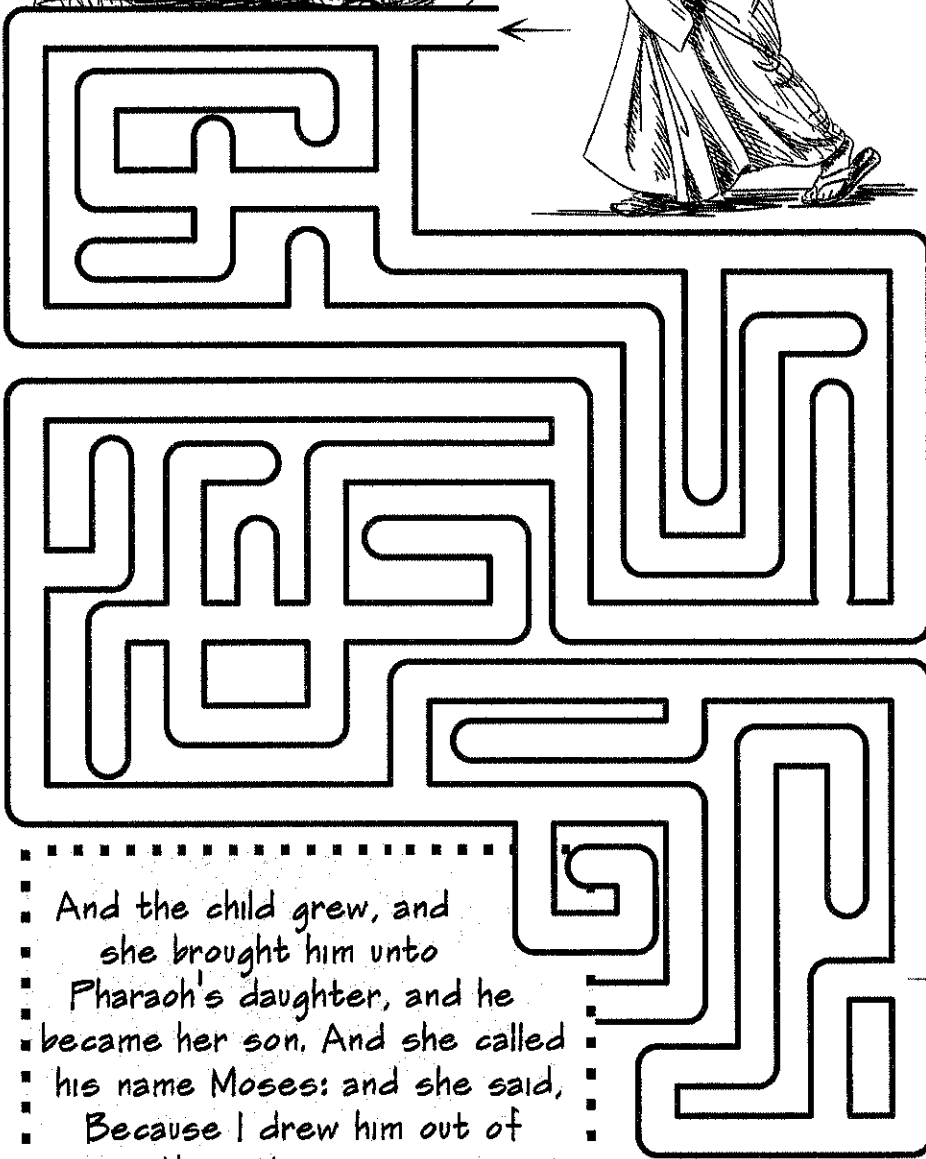

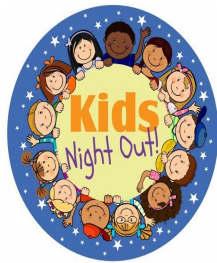
