Administrative Council

The Solid Rock Administrative Council met on September 15. The treasurer's report showed August offerings of \$16,900 and Building Fund contributions totaling \$9,848. Assets total \$380,646. Of this, approximately \$215,000 is designated for the building fund.

The trustees presented updated wedding policies, which were adopted by the Council. The trustees also recommended, and council approved, the purchase of a new refrigerator for the kitchen. The trustees reported that logos and lettering will be painted on the church bus in the near future.

The Council requested that the Finance Committee meet to provide clarification of procedures for the handling of designated gifts.

Mandy Bordeaux reported for the committee investigating locations for an off-site ministry. A number of promising sites have been identified, and the committee was encouraged to continue their work.

Council was presented proposed budgets and officers for 2010, and both were approved. The 2010 budget totals \$163,739, which will be funded by average weekly offerings of \$3,149.

Henderson Settlement Mission Trip
