This includes teaching electricity, internet connectivity, plumbing, and insulated concrete form technology. In the four year history of Homes for Haitians, this ministry, based in Churubusco, Indiana, has completed 15 homes, a maternity clinic, a women's business center, two schools, and two orphanages.
